Improvement Group Projects:

Wendy Oney presented all the stages of the projects that the NFIG are planning. (See attached Update)

The NFIG has received an additional \$2,500.00 for the pickle ball court. They have also received \$3,000.00 from Firelands Electric. Fremont Fence will be giving a free estimate to put a fence around the pickleball court.

The NFIG has received \$45,000.00 from the Board of Disabilities. This money must be used by the end of 2024.

Joshua Radcliffe made a motion to allow the North Fairfield Improvement Group to move forward with stage 3 in the update dated September 30, 2024. Sharleen Coy seconded the motion. Hershel Honeycutt discussed the bleachers in the park. It would cost \$400-\$500 to replace the wood and for new hardware. This would be better than scrapping and having to buy new. Council is going to think on this.

North Fairfield Improvement Group Promoting Active and Healthy Lifestyles in an All-Inclusive Environment

The mission of the North Fairfield Improvement Group is to strengthen our small town by preserving its unique character, enhancing public spaces, and fostering a strong sense of community. We strive to create a vibrant, welcoming town where everyone feels connected and valued.

Short-term goals:

Stage 1 - Sand Volleyball Court - completed. Families and friends have been using it. A summer volleyball league run by SC volleyball is a possibility for 2025, along with a possible tournament during the Street Fair.

Stage 2 - Pickleball Court - Concrete poured by Bart Bergstedt. Marc Carruthers, New Era Surfacing in Wakeman, is available to finish it this fall. Possible tournament at the Street Fair.

Stage 3 - ADA Accessible and Inclusive Village Park - follow best practices and ADA accessibility guidelines for wheeled mobility to enjoy our village park and

playground. Our proposal:

- 1) Install a 5' concrete path that replaces the existing path
- Install 5' concrete sidewalks to the pavilion, basketball court, pickleball court, and playground
- Add an additional bay to the current swing set. Add 2 accessible swing seats (as shown)
- 4) Install a parking area at the west end of the park with two handicap parking spaces

Accessible Swing Seat

AGES: 2-12

- Available in 7' (2,13m), 8' (2,44m), and 10' (3,05m) top rail versions
- Can be used on many of the swing sets shown here

Conversations have taken place with the superintendent of the Huron County Board of Developmental Disabilities, a representative of Accessible Ohio, and Nick Sanchez of Midstates Recreation in the planning stages for making the park and playground ADA accessible.

Budget Item	Approximate Cost
Walking Path, 4 Sidewalks, Two Handicap Parking Spaces	\$38,000
Additional Swingset Bay, 2 Accessible Swing Seats	\$ 7,000
Approximate Cost for Completing Stage 3	\$45,000

Long-term Goals:

Stage 4 -May/June/July 2025 - Add Poured-in-Place (PIP) surfacing for under the additional swing bay with the two accessible swing seats. Connect PIP to the concrete sidewalk to the playground; Possibly add fencing for the pickleball court

Stage 5: 2025/2026/2027- Pump Track and Comfort Station/Restroom
