COMPENSATION ORC 731.13

AN ORDINANCE <u>AMENDING AND</u> FIXING THE COMPENSATION OF ALL OFFICERS, CLERKS, AND EMPLOYEES OF THE VILLAGE FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR AND REPEALING ANY AND ALL PREVIOUS LEGISLATION INCONSISTENT HEREWITH AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Section 731.13 of the Ohio Revised Code requires in part:

Section 731.13 | Compensation and bonds of village officers, clerks and employees.

The legislative authority of a village shall fix the compensation and bonds of all officers, clerks, and employees of the village except as otherwise provided by law.

WHEREAS, No political subdivision shall establish a minimum wage rate different from the wage rate required under this section. See ORC Section 4111.02; and

WHEREAS, to maintain the efficient fiscal operations, Village Council deems it necessary to adjust the fixed compensation of officers, clerks, and employees from time to time; and

WHEREAS, Compensation was previously fixed in Ord No.: 2020-O-05 and subsequently amended; and

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary to amend the compensation for the Fiscal Officer.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT <u>ORDAINED</u> BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF <u>NORTH FAIRFIELD</u>, STATE OF OHIO: (RC 731.18)

SECTION 1. That pursuant to Section 731.13 of the Ohio Revised Code, the legislative authority of the village hereby <u>AMENDS 2020-O-05 AND</u> fixes the compensation off all officers, clerks and employees of the village as follows:

SECTION 2. EFFECT. That this Ordinance shall take effect RETROACTIVELY on: 12/01/2024

SECTION 3. RETROACTIVE. That Village Council expressly intends this legislation to operate retrospectively pursuant to Section 1.48 of the Ohio Revised Code. Council further finds that the retroactive application does not takes away or impair vested rights acquired under current existing laws, nor does it create new obligations, nor imposes a new duty, nor attaches a new disability, in respect to transactions or considerations already passed and adopted.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. That this Ordinance and the various parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses thereof are hereby declared to be severable. Should any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause be declared unconstitutional, null, or void by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not have any effect on the validity of the remaining parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses of this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 5</u>. <u>REPEAL</u>. That all previous actions fixing compensation inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded and repealed.
