North Fairfield Improvement Group Promoting Active and Healthy Lifestyles in an All-Inclusive Environment



Update:

Stage 1 - Sand Volleyball Court - completed. People have been using it. A volleyball tournament during the Street Fair run by SC volleyball is planned. We probably need 2 more loads of sand. Jim Prater assisted us with getting the correct type of sand last year.

Stage 2 - Pickleball Court - Concrete poured by Bart Bergstedt of B&S Contracting. Marc Carruthers, of New Era Surfacing in Wakeman, finished it this fall. Possible tournament at the Street Fair. Basketball court resurfaced. There are cracks in some of the seams on both courts. Contacted Marc today, and he is going to look into it. We are fencing the pickleball court this summer.

Stage 3 - Concrete work and playground - installed 5' concrete walking path and concrete sidewalks. Nick Sanchez, of Midstates Recreation, is our rep for installing the swing bay with the handicap swing seats and poured-in-place surfacing. I have a meeting with him at 1 PM on Thursday, April 24 at the park to discuss the handicap swing bay and PIP installation prep. If Jim Prater and Russ Scriver could also attend this meeting, that would be great, as Nick will discuss with us the area for peeling back all the mulch



(with the tractor), all the way to the pan. A handicap accessible picnic table, two benches along the walking track and playground borders have been ordered. Gravel and dumpster provided by Midstates Recreation. Possible start date for adding the handicap accessible swing bay and PIP - week of May 12 - will need some type of fencing to go around the PIP while it cures.

Parking Lot - move handicap signs and add lines for dedicated handicap parking - Depict designated parking at opposite end of lot. Checked into the price to concrete the entire parking lot— \$18,000. Additional signage?
